MCNS Polyurethanes Europe is concerned by reports that profits from the sale of certain minerals mined in the Indonesia and conflict affected regions in Africa has helped fund war and human rights violations in these regions.

MCNS Polyurethanes Europe supports the goal of ending violence, human rights violations and environmental devastation in 'Conflict-Affected and High-Risk areas' and is committed to complying with all requirements applicable to our company under the Conflict Mineral Rule.

MCNS polyurethanes Europe will assist our customers in implementing their conflict minerals programs. We strive to work cooperatively with our customers and supply chain partners in implementing conflict minerals compliance programs.

MCNS Polyurethanes Europe requires that suppliers whose products contain tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold submit this information to us using the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template which traces the minerals back through the supply chain. MCNS Polyurethanes Europe also supports industry initiatives such as the Conflict Free Smelter program to validate responsible and sustainable sources. Our objective is to implement a conflict-free supply chain and should we become aware of a supplier whose supply chain includes minerals from a conflict source, MCNS Polyurethanes Europe will take appropriate actions to remedy the situation in a timely manner, including reassessment of supplier relationships, to achieve that objective. MCNS Polyurethanes Europe expects our suppliers to take similar measures with their suppliers to ensure alignment throughout the supply chain.
